***Mystery Solved!***

When we received notification of a memorial gift from a Helen O. Knock in memory of her brother, Louis V. Olson, we racked our collective brains to place the name in the history of our church. It took a bit of searching, but Pat Pegg (thank you, Pat) found the needle in the haystack. The answer was contained in her obituary. Here is what it said:

“Helen Elizabeth Olson Knock, a longtime resident of Harrison, NY, died on Sunday, December 21, 2008 at The Osborn, Rye, NY. She was 91, Born on October 4, 1917 in Plainville, CT, she was the daughter of Louis Virgil and Agnes Paulson Olson. She earned an executive secretarial diploma from Morse College, Hartford, CT. On June 15, 1944, she married Daniel Benjamin Knock of Holland, Iowa at the Plainville Congregational Church. In 1947, she and her family moved to Harrison, NY, where she lived in her Willets Road home for 53 years. “

We are extremely grateful for her gift of \$5,000 to our church and thankful that our church played such an important and blessed role in her life. She left us this money in her brother’s memory when she passed.

## Transitional Ministry Update

This update will be the first in a series about the Transitional Ministry process and our Church.

Many of you know that Rev. Dr. Claire Bamberg has been ministering to us in various capacities for a little more than two years now. In June 2007 we entered into a formal Transitional Ministry Covenant with Claire, the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ and the Committee on Church and Ministry of the Farmington Valley Association (of which we are members). We are the first Church in Connecticut to utilize this ministerial classification, although it has been used in some other states.

The typical process for filling a ministerial vacancy involves the selection of an Interim Minister to serve the church during the Pastoral Search Process, the establishment of a Pastoral Search Committee, the development of a Church "Profile" (our Church's "resume" if you will), the review of Ministerial Profiles (a Minister's "resume"), the selection of a final candidate, the issuance of a Ministerial Call, and hopefully, a new minister accepted the call and a new ministerial covenant is formed. The Interim Minister cannot be called to serve the church, and cannot serve the church for more than two years, thereby encouraging the Search process to move along.

Under the Transitional Ministry process, the Transitional Minister helps the church transition from one size to another, through one developmental phase to another, or through an unexpected and unsettling event towards more stability. The Transitional Minister serves the church in accordance with a Transitional Ministry Covenant. In our case, the Covenant between our church and Claire began in June 2007 and extends until December 31, 2010. A similar process to the typical process used to fill a ministerial vacancy is followed to the point that the Church's Profile is completed. At that point, the Pastoral Search Committee will obtain Claire's profile and will discern if the two profiles are close enough to be considered a match. If that determination is made, a ministerial call must be issued to Claire. At that point, it is her right to accept the call or to inform the church that it should conduct a search for another candidate. If a search is initiated, it would follow the typical process until a new minister is called.

It is time for us to initiate the development our Church's Profile, but first, the Church Council must appoint a Pastoral Search Committee. As we continue through this process we will issue periodic updates. If you have any questions about this process, please speak to me, and I try to answer questions and allay your concerns. 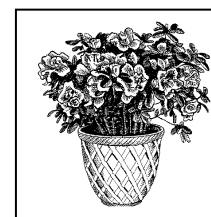
